Learning outcome(s):

In this lesson all learners will:

Discuss and capture observational skills to analyse painting

Acquire visual literacy (ability to 'read' objects, to find meaning in. them)

Develop communication and critical analytic skills

Gain an understanding of key concepts (objective & subjective, qualities)

Develop confidence, awareness and knowledge

0.0	Intro session: Group Crit using Maurice Merleau-Ponty's "touching - touched" exercise to analyse a painting.		
2-3 min			
	Present object - Painting by Yaqi (CSM Foundation Painting student)		
	Present Activity - Group Crit involves 2 short exercises.		
	Merleau-Ponty;s 'touching - touched' exercise		
	2. Applying this exercise to an artwork.		
	Exercise 1: Merleau-Ponty's touched-touching exercise involves 2 hands touching.		
5-7 min	- Ask students to close their eyes and feel the sensatons of their two hands touching.		
	- Draw awareness to the hand being touched, then draw awareness to the hand touching		
	- Ask students to pay attention to the feeling of one hand being touched, how does it feel? (soothing, calming)		
	- Ask students to pay attention to the feeling of touching the other hand, how does it feel? (rough, smooth, details)		
	- Ask students to pay attention what happens when they try to hold both sensations in their mind simultaneously		
	 Ask students if they notice how the mind slips from one to other. 		
	 Explain how this first hand (the touched) will be called the subjective one; second hand (the touching) will be called the objective one. 		
10-12	 Exercise 2: Applying "touching - touched" to painting (explain we are now going to touch with our eyes) 		
min	- Ask students to look at the painting and pay attention to what they see and how they feel		
	- Ask students to offer one response each of how the painting makes them feel. (subjective)		
	Identify these as "affective qualities"		
	- Ask the students to offer one response each describing a quality they see (objective)		
	Identify these as "formal qualities" / Colour, Gesture, Line, Shape		
	- Ask students to create a sentence using the subjective and objective together (use their own or each others)		
Finish	- Repeat last task (if time permits)
